

Channing and ie 'start As they make their red carpet debut as a couple – again – we reveal the truth behind Channing and Jessie J's short-lived split

fter one of the briefest break-ups in showbiz, Channing Tatum and Jessie J are very much back together - and they want the world to know!

The 31-year-old British singer and her buff beau, 39, announced their split in November after a year of dating, but have spent recent days packing on the PDAs at red carpet bashes and declaring their love for each other all over social media.

They looked more smitten than ever as they posed for pictures at the Grammys last week, before hitting an after-party hosted by Jessie's label Republic Records - with the pop star sharing several videos on Instagram Stories during the night.

The snaps came after the couple confirmed they were back on and stronger than ever with a series of defiant posts, including one in which Magic Mike star Channing fiercely defended his girlfriend against a troll who compared Jessie unfavourably to his ex-wife Jenna Dewan.

When one follower commented, "Jenna looks better with you" under a snap of him and Jessie on Instagram, the actor hit

back, "Ain't nobody more stunning and beautiful to look at but even more as a human than Jess. And yeah that includes my ex." Jessie responded with a gleeful, "My BABY! Horns OUT!"

It's no wonder the hater hit a nerve, as we can reveal one of the reasons behind the couple's shock split was the strain of the custody battle between Channing and Jenna over their six-year-old daughter Everly.

"Jessie and Channing split due to the mounting pressure of his custody battle, which became too much and led them to part ways, but it was clear they both still loved one another and were completely heartbroken," a source told **new**.

"Channing reached out to Jessie about a week after they split and begged to see her - admitting he'd made a huge mistake pushing her away amid the stress in his life and asking her to move in with him."

With Channing and Jenna agreeing to split custody 50/50 last week, the path was clear for he and Jessie to move forward, though the insider adds it was a tough call for the Bang Bang singer.

"Jessie was initially hesitant, but after spending some

> quality time together and realising the intense pain he's been in over the custody battle, it made her see how different it would be once that burden was finally lifted, which is

exactly what happened," our mole explained. "As soon as the custody agreeement was made,

And it seems Jessie is in it for the long haul, too.

After Channing's chivalrous display on Instagram, she posted a video of him kissing her and playfully biting her face at an Aerosmith tribute concert, where she performed.

She captioned the snap. "I love you so much baby @channingtatum. The way you love me and the way I love you and the way we feel it is all that matters." He replied with no fewer than 44 love heart emojis.

Caprice Bourret on toning up thanks to Dancing On Ice, her amazing sex life and the highs and lows of motherhood

eeting Caprice Bourret for our exclusive photoshoot, we're blown away by the 48-year-old's jaw-dropping figure as she strips off into her swimwear.

Caprice, who is currently competing in Dancing On Ice, says taking to the rink has given her the best body of her life and by the look of her visible abs and toned arms, she's not wrong!

The former model, who admits she enjoyed a pizza the night before our shoot, has lost more than a stone, now tipping the scales at 9st 1lb, and has dropped a dress size to a "solid 8".

"I feel amazing," she tells us while having her make-up applied. "I have more energy. Maybe it's all adrenaline, but I just feel better. I'm eating really clean and healthy and that contributes."

Caprice was originally paired with pro skater Hamish Gaman, but is now partnered with Oscar Peter. Questions about the sudden switch are strictly off limits, but last week Hamish tweeted to say "I'm not okay" and thanked fans for their support.

As well as rehearsing up to five hours a day for the ITV show, Caprice is mum to six-year-old boys Jax and Jett and fits in the school run between training sessions.

As we natter, it's clear to see her home life is happy. She's still basking in the newlywed glow after her Christmas wedding to

businessman Ty Comfort, who she's been with for nine years, and can't stop gushing about him during our interview.

"We're chalk and cheese, so that's what works," she says. 'There's a lot of respect and he's just perfect for me."

Here, Caprice opens up about their blended family, her improved between-the-sheets action and why two kids are more than enough for her...

Hi Caprice! Do you feel confident being in a swimsuit for our shoot? Honey, I can't wait to take my clothes off. Are you joking?!

You said you've lost more than a stone. How has your body changed?

I have a better body now than when I was in my twenties. Skating is the best exercise I've ever done. You're working every single muscle, especially after childbirth when you get fat in

crazy places. Because you're working everything, it's gone especially my love handles and a bulge on my tummy I just couldn't get rid of. I'm not lifting weights, I'm not going to the gym, it's purely skating.

Are you eating more?

Yes, I need the energy. Otherwise you just faint.

Is your diet quite strict?

Yeah. Now it is, but I love junk food so much. I'm eating really clean - my body needs the vitamins because I'm burning off so much. The exercise is really vigorous and I'm not a spring chicken, so I've really had to look after myself. So lots of fruits and vegetables and very little sugar. I'll carb out, because I need my carbs. Have you been craving anything? Anything I crave, I eat! The other day I was craving cake mix, so I ate it. It's OK, I deserve it.

Have you ever been a slave to the gym?

Yes! My whole life. My family has naturally very voluptuous bodies. I look at food and I'll put on weight. After I had the kids, I didn't really care. I just became so consumed with parenthood and being a mum. But now I have my body back, I wonder when this all ends how I'm going to maintain it. I love it! Will you carry on skating?

I didn't think I'd love it this much. I'd love to continue to improve and get better and better.

What was your normal exercise regime before Dancing On Ice? [Goes quiet] Well... um... not

I can't stand going to the gym.

airbrushing a picture?

Not on my social media, I don't

know how to. If I knew how, I'd probably do it. But when I used to do all my lingerie shoots I would. There was one shoot that wasn't Photoshopped and the sales went down. I don't do it with my shape, just my freckles, so I have a smoother skin tone.

You've admitted to having a bit of "baby Botox". Would you ever have cosmetic surgery?

Do you know what, even with a bit of Botox I still have my wrinkles, my face still moves. I'm OK, I've earned these wrinkles. Would I have surgery? I could tell you now, no. But who knows? I don't want to be called a liar in 20 years' time.

Would you like to do any more fitness challenges?

No, but I really want to get into my acting. A show like this gets you out there and gets you relevant again. And I love to skate – even though my nerves have gone through the roof. What's so nice is people have been so supportive - people I don't even know. It's gone nuts. It makes me feel good. Have you got any acting jobs in the pipeline?

I did a lot last year, but this year I've had to block out, because there's no room for anything. My life is Dancing On Ice right now. I can't do castings. I'd love to go back on the West End stage because I'm loving the performance aspect of this. What would be your dream role? I think I'd slot right in on 9 To 5 The Musical or Chicago. What's been the hardest part of doing Dancing On Ice so far?

Learning the choreography in four days in something so new. You have to learn the steps on ice and then you have to add in the arms and then memorise it – and then you have to smile! It's hard. The training is very demanding, but I love it.

When did you start training?

October, but we have to be able to do what we're doing. I've never skated before in my life and it's been so intense.

How is it now being partnered up with Oscar Peter?

He is so talented and a beautiful soul. I can't believe I am skating with a three-time Swiss national champion.

Do you have many bruises?

Hello! [Lifts up her sleeve to show a nasty bruise.] On my shoulders and on my ribs, that's just the name of the game.

Do you ever get scared you'll fall doing some of the moves?

With this you have to dive in and you have to be fearless.

How do you get on with the other celebs?

I love them. It's funny, I know it's supposed to be a competition, but we're not like that. Everyone is genuinely so excited and so supportive as the turnaround is so fast between shows. We're all having a blast.

Who have you bonded with?

I love H! He's so sweet. Libs [Clegg] is my girl. Whenever I'm feeling down or depressed, Swashy comes up with that big smile. Everyone's amazing. Kevin Kilbane and Brianne

Kevin Kilbane and Brianne Delcourt have confirmed they're a couple...

[Screams] Yeah! We all saw that coming.

Are they constantly snogging backstage?

They're tactile, they don't snog and gross us out. But they're so cute.

Are there any other romances on the cards?

No, everyone is pretty much taken. **Do you get on with the judges?**

I haven't really got to know Ashley Banjo, but John Barrowman is amazing and I love Chris Dean and Jayne Torvill.

Were you happy the judges saved you when you found yourself in the bottom two?

I was so grateful. I had a big celebration that night.

What about the presenters Phillip Schofield and Holly Willoughby? I love them! They're so nice and so supportive.

What do you make of rumours about tensions between them? I think it's all rubbish. And from what I've seen I don't think

he cares.

Yeah – that made history. God, it's about time. And thank God it's *Dancing On Ice* that's done it first. My mum saw one of the performances on the news in America. It's gone viral!

You're approaching 50. Have you

got any plans to celebrate? I'm going to have the biggest

party you've ever seen. I'm going

to have a whole weekend in Ibiza with 200 people. I'm going to start planning it right after I finish the show.

How do you feel about turning 50?

What's funny is I was absolutely traumatised when I turned 30, but I'm embracing turning 50.

Has your outlook changed as

Has your outlook cha you've got older?

As a woman I've changed. I think motherhood has a lot to do with it. I have a husband, I have two children and life is pretty good.

Do you end up caring less?

You just don't care. Your priorities change and you don't make as many ridiculous blockbusters in your head that you do when you're younger. You have more responsibility and you chill out. When I was younger I wanted to change things and I was very critical of myself. Now I'm very accepting of myself.

Is that the same with your body?

It's terrible to say, because my body has never been better, but before I did the skating I was very accepting of the lumps and bumps and the cellulite. I was like, "I've earned these! And if you don't like it, sorry."

Would you like to have any more children?

Honey, I'm 48 – are you serious?! That boat has sailed. I'm done. I'm very blessed to have my two. Would you ever adopt?

No. I'm very blessed with my two boys and I have three stepkids as well, so we're done.

What do you make of Cameron Diaz having a baby at 47?

Good on her! That's one heck of an accomplishment. It's hard when you get older.

What's the toughest thing about being a mum?

Everything. I was so naive before I had kids. I thought, "Nothing's going to change. I'll get a babysitter, I'm still going to work as hard. My whole life isn't going to be any different." My God... how stupid was I? Even if you have babysitters — and I don't have my family here — your kids want you. How many nights have I been up because my kids can't sleep and then I have to do the school run and go to work? Then I have to do dinner and bath and

Doing movies. I've never really pursued it, but it's interesting. At the age of 48 you think, "Really, you're going to start another new career?" But at 48 there's not much competition and women in their forties are the new twenties. There are a lot of opportunities out there.

Is there anyone in the industry whose career you admire?

I love Cate Blanchett and Charlize Theron. They're beautiful, strong, talented and as private as they can be. They're amazing.

Can you win Dancing On Ice?
I don't know. I'm going to give it my best shot, though.

What would it mean to you to win?

I think it would mean more to my kids, but more than anything I want to stay in the competition because I just love it.

Jessie is suffering her worst nightmare

With reports of an *EastEnders* 'ban', the actress has hit rock bottom

ctress Jessie Wallace is said to be feeling desperately low after allegedly being suspended from EastEnders just one month after splitting up with Paul Keepin.

One report claimed the 48-year-old has been banned from the show for two months after allegedly being drunk on set while filming for the soap's 35th anniversary, which is set to air on 19 February.

The popular star was said to be shooting boat party scenes on the Thames

scenes on the with co-stars Danny Dyer, Jake Wood and Scott Maslen before she was called into a crisis meeting. It's believed the show's scriptwriters

are now looking at how to explain her absence.

"Jessie was clearly tipsy and got very verbal," the report claimed. "Bosses were left with no choice but to discipline her. During the meeting she was told to sort herself out before returning to work."

In happier days

with her ex Paul

The mum-of-one is said to be devastated by the move, especially as it came so soon after her break-up with market trader Paul after two years together.



The pair split just before Christmas, with a source saying at the time, "She is moving on and wants the new year to be a fresh start when she will focus on work."

Now that has been taken away from her, we're told she feels horribly alone.

"Jessie has been left terribly lonely, shocked and isolated by her split with Paul," a source told **new**. "She is desperately down about the situation with *EastEnders* and would do anything to make things right.

"That's been her worst nightmare. She feels she's lost two of the most important things in her life – her love and her job. And she feels people are judging her without knowing the whole story and that really hurts."

Her split with Paul is the latest heartbreak in Jessie's turbulent love life, which includes three failed engagements — one of which was to Dave Morgan, the father of her 15-year-old daughter Tallulah.

"She has a great circle of friends who are rallying round her, but at the minute it's hard for her to take their reassurance on board. She's sleeping badly and is understandably worrying







Hi Jodie! How has your outlook on life changed

now you're in your forties?

When you get to my age, you think, "I've done ë it." So I'm not 문 so freaked out

[about my age] and you learn from your mistakes. You're more comfortable with yourself because you know yourself so much better. In your twenties everything is new and exciting. Has your take on relationships also changed?

Oh God, yeah. There are a lot of people out there who aren't who they say they are. Everyone learns from their mistakes. You seem very happy with

your man... That absolutely helps - when you have a lovely man! And my son Indio is just a superstar, so that's another plus of getting older. There's not so much messing

the interiors and decorated it. Now it's been up and running for a couple of years, I've become very understanding of the wonders and hardships of being a landlady. I'm also going to do a couple of shows at Fashion Week. Do you pull pints at the pub? Oh God, yeah! It's a really tough industry - we're losing three pubs

a day and in the countryside

they're so important to the community. We sponsor our local cricket team, we have our WI meetings and there is so much more to it, rurally. My ethos

with the pub is to support local producers — I didn't want to get in anything from further than a 25-mile radius. It's been blood, sweat and tears, but it's fun now.

Have you got any TV projects in the pipeline?

There are a few. One is involving the pub industry and one is involving cars, which I love. There are a few others that are bubbling away. It'll be fun to get in front of the camera again.

You've been living the quiet

life in the countryside. Have you missed being on TV?

Yeah, it's my job. Getting back into modelling as well – who knew at 41?! It's what I'm good at and I really enjoy it. Doing crazy things like buying your local pub is great

fun, but I'm excited to get back to what I love and adore, which is getting in front of the camera.

How has the modelling industry changed since your heyday?

I'm not in it like I used to be, but I don't think it's changed, barely at all. The biggest thing is the social media side and how important that is nowadays — thank God we didn't have social media when I was flat out working in the early 2000s! The industry is a juggernaut.

Do you see social media as a bad thing?

It has big positives and big negatives. It's a good way of keeping in contact and networking. But what people perceive from an Instagram image that might have been doctored can be very false. There's a big, worrying side to these images that aren't real — and the younger generation thinks it's the norm. And it's not.

Why did you get involved with the Give Up Clothes For Good campaign?

It's such a simple thing that adds up to such a massive thing. Coming off the back of Christmas, you might have got a few jumpers you can donate — it's a good time to refresh your wardrobe just by filling up a bag and taking it to TK Maxx. All that money goes to Cancer Research. They've been doing it for 15 years and millions of pounds have been raised. It's just a wonderful idea that's changing so many children and young people's lives. It's a real delight to be involved.





Not at all. Mum said, "She's 25 - she can do what she wants!" If she won the prize money, what would she do with it?


She'd definitely split it. She went in for one thing and that was love. The fame and money comes with it, I suppose. Hopefully she'd put it down on a house, because she's still living at home.



'A hospital blunder made me forget I'd given birth'

When Becky Jones, 29, from Stoke-on-Trent, suffered stomach pains after having her baby daughter, she never could have imagined the nightmare that would follow

rowning, I rubbed my bump and leaned against the kitchen table. "I haven't felt her move much today," I told my partner Dave. "I think I should get checked out."

I was pregnant with my second baby, a little girl. Everything had gone well so far, except for some morning sickness and heartburn.

But now, with three weeks to my due date, I was feeling a little concerned. Just to be on the safe side, I went to hospital. Everything was fine, but I was told to come back the following day to be monitored.

This time, the baby's heart rate had dropped. I felt a rush of anxiety. "Is she OK?" I asked.

There was a discussion among the doctors about what to do next.

"I just want her to be safe," I said.

After what felt like hours, the doctors decided it was time to deliver her and I was induced. I began to feel more settled now something was being done, and I was excited too - I was about to meet my baby. But 12 hours on. Dave was still rubbing my back and holding my hand.

My labour with my first baby, Riley, had been straightforward and I'd expected this birth to be the same. Now, though, I was in dreadful discomfort and the midwives seemed concerned.

Eventually, with another wave of pain, I gave birth to our beautiful daughter, Ruby, on 7 March 2015, weighing 5lb 9oz. As I held her in my arms for my first cuddle, I felt a rush of love.

"She's beautiful," Dave smiled. "Just perfect."

The next day we were allowed home, but before we left I mentioned to the midwife that I was still having stomach pains.

"That will just be the uterus contracting," she said. "It's normal."

I felt so proud taking Ruby home, but all through that evening I had terrible stomach cramps. They got so bad, I couldn't sleep.

Early the next morning Dave called the midwife, but she said she thought I was probably just constipated and advised him to pop to the chemist for a constipation remedy.

As the hours passed, I started to feel much worse. I was feverish and confused. We spoke to another midwife, who advised me to take painkillers. But soon I was in agony a dull, gnawing ache in my lower belly. I felt shivery and cold, but sweat was dripping down my face.

HOSPITAL DASH

Even though I was so ill, nobody seemed to be taking it seriously. I began to wonder if I was overreacting and making too much

of it. But about 24 hours later the pain spread to my legs.

"I think it's really serious," said. He began googling my symptoms.

"I know it sounds doctor," he said

at the surgery, I was too weak even to get out of the car, so I had to have a wheelchair.

The doctor did a few checks then said, "You need to get to hospital. I think the car will be guicker than waiting for an ambulance." Dave rushed to meet me and drove me to

the Royal Stoke University Hospital, where I'd given birth. I was wheeled into a cubicle at the maternity assessment unit.

> Time passed – I had no idea how long as I was barely lucid. I had a blood test, but then nothing happened.

Dave was becoming more and more anxious as my pain grew even worse.

"I think my partner has sepsis," he told the nurses. "She had a baby three days ago. Can you please help? She's been waiting for far too long."

He was panic-stricken, but I was feverish and too sick to care. After seven long hours a doctor came to see me and then, suddenly, it was chaos.

By this time, I was too ill to really

failure," said the doctor. "We're going to

understand what was happening.

When I finally came round, confused and sleepy, Dave was at my bedside.

"You've been in a coma for nearly three weeks," he told me softly. "We were told you were going to die."

I was traumatised by what he was saying. I couldn't remember anything and didn't even know why I was in hospital.

"You've just had a little baby – Ruby," he told me. I stared at him blankly. I'd even forgotten I'd given birth.

Drifting in and out of consciousness, I had crazy dreams. In one, I dreamt that my dad had died. In another, my mum and her partner were drifting out at sea. It was hard to separate reality from fantasy.

separate reality from fantasy.
Slowly I began to recover, but it was difficult and painful. Hazy memories of my daughter returned. I remembered our

first cuddle and I longed to hold her in my

arms again. I missed Ruby and my son, Riley, so much.

When I finally went home five weeks later, at the end of April, it was bittersweet. I was relieved to be back, but I was in such a state. I needed help walking, dressing and eating. I couldn't even go the loo on my own.

Because I couldn't care for myself, I couldn't look after Ruby, which was heartbreaking. I was too weak to even put a nappy on her or to fasten the press studs on her sleepsuit. I felt like such a failure.

STRUGGLING TO BOND

Dave's sister Sue, a hairdresser, was with wonderful and offered to look after Ruby until I was better. But it was hard seeing the connection they shared. I felt so guilty that I wasn't the one looking after my baby girl and I struggled to bond with her. Those first few precious months had gone and I'd never get them back.

But worse was to come. My dad, David, 50, had previously struggled with his mental health, but after I

Losing Dad was horrific – it brought back memories of my time in hospital and my dreams about his death.

Mum and her partner split up, too, just like in my dream. It felt horribly spooky.

In September 2018, University Hospitals of North Midlands (UHNM) NHS Trust admitted breaching its duty of care over my treatment. The settlement is still being discussed.

An investigation found staff had "miscalculated" the true extent of my symptoms when I was first assessed at the Royal Stoke University Hospital. I should have been seen by a registrar within 30 minutes — instead, I had to wait seven hours.

I'm glad they've admitted things went wrong, but it will never make up for the time I missed with Ruby.

I had a third child, George, in May 2018. The pregnancy was fraught because I was worried about it all going wrong again. I had regular checks and I was extra careful, but I panicked about the slightest twinge.

George's birth made me realise just how important those first few weeks are and brought into sharp focus how much I had missed out on with Ruby. But I won't look back. Ruby's now four and has grown into a beautiful, funny little girl. We are making up for lost time.



'My cancer battle put me on top of the world'

Former air stewardess Yasmin Haque, 56, from Cheadle, celebrated her recovery from breast cancer by climbing Everest – with a *Corrie* star!

athering myself with shower gel, I suddenly felt a small lump in my left breast. Turning, I tried to feel from a different angle, but there it was again. Straight after my shower, I got dressed and called the doctors' surgery. I wasn't particularly worried, but I'd never been the sort of person to put things off and wanted to make sure everything was OK.

"Shall I come with you?" my husband, Afzal, 63, asked. "No, honestly, it will be fine," I replied.

My GP confirmed that she could feel the lump, which was only pea-sized, but she didn't seem too concerned. I was referred for checks, just as a precaution. It was early April 2010 before I was seen at Withington Community Hospital in Manchester, seven weeks after I found the lump.

After a biopsy, I was called back to the hospital for the results the following week. I still wasn't worried – the lump hadn't grown and it wasn't painful. And at 46, I was fit and healthy, juggling looking after my two children with my job as cabin crew for British Airways. I was sure it would be good news.

But when the doctor walked into the room, I could immediately see something was wrong. Her face was blanched and deadly serious. Her words, when they came, seemed





to be in slow motion. It was almost as though she was speaking under water.

"I'm sorry to tell you, you have breast cancer," she said. "Did I hear her right?" I stuttered, grabbing Afzal's hand.

We left the hospital in a daze and both sobbed all the way home. All I could think of was the impact on my two children, Amber and Kamran. Amber was 18 and studying for her A levels, while Kamran was only 14. We didn't want to worry them and disrupt Amber's studies, so Afzal and I decided to keep it from them until we knew more. I

couldn't bear the idea of breaking their hearts.

Two weeks on, when I had the operation to remove the lump, we just told the children I was having minor surgery.

The results came through quickly and the news was good. "The cancer hasn't spread," my consultant told me. "You won't need any further treatment."

We were thrilled. Afzal, who's a property developer, and I told the children it had been cancer, but it was over and there was no need to worry. Then we went out to celebrate.

But a year on, in February 2011, my heart sank when I found another lump in the same breast.

I was referred to the Nightingale Centre, a specialist unit at Wythenshawe Hospital, Manchester, and after a scan, I got the news I was dreading – my cancer was back.

Again, I had the lump removed and after surgery I recovered well. But this time, I needed chemotherapy too.

My first session of chemo was on the same day as one of Amber's exams. I didn't tell her a thing because she'd been studying so hard and I didn't want to distract her. I carried on as normal, ensuring my make-up was perfect

and my nails were polished every day, because that was who I was. I didn't want to lose sense of myself and I also didn't want the children to notice any difference.

It was only after all Amber's exams were over that we told her and Kamran the cancer was back. I was partway through my first cycle of chemo and I'd managed to hide the side effects up till then. I tried to make light of it and be strong for their sakes, but they were both so upset that we all cried together.

SUPPORTIVE CORRIE STAR

Sometimes, at the hospital, I'd bump into the actress Sally Dynevor, who plays Sally Metcalfe in *Coronation Street*. She was being treated for breast cancer too.

When I first saw her I had just been given the devastating news that I needed chemo. She gave me a huge hug and said, "Not to worry. You will get through this."

Sally talked about her treatment, which had been going on for some time, and that really helped me know what to expect

The following year, my treatment ended and in 2018 I was officially discharged from hospital. We celebrated with a lovely family holiday in Ibiza, then in October that year fundraisers at

the hospital asked if I would take part in a trek to Everest base camp, for Prevent Breast Cancer. At first, I shook my head and laughed. I'd never done any kind of endurance

activity before. The only walking I did was shopping around the Trafford Centre in Manchester or walking from the hotel room to the pool on holiday!

BIG CHALLENGE

But as I thought it over, the idea started to really appeal to me. "I'll do the trek with you, Mum," Amber offered. That clinched it for me. It was a big challenge, but I was determined.

The 18-day trek took place last November. There were 33 of us, including Sally from Corrie. Everyone had had cancer or were close family or friends of people who had. It was very tough and I suffered with altitude sickness and was constantly

throwing up. At points I got so dizzy, but the Sherpas were so encouraging. It was a brilliant experience, the area was amazing and the locals were so kind and welcoming. It was humbling to see people who had very

little materially just making the most of things. It really brought home to me that money doesn't matter - your health and the ones you love are so much more important.

Reaching the camp, dizzy with sickness and exhaustion, I felt an amazing sense of pride and elation. It was spectacular - like going back in time.

So far, Amber and I have raised more than £10,000 through our personal appeal page and donations continue to come in. The trek itself has raised more than £117,000. I knew my family and friends would chip in, but I was stunned that complete strangers donated too.

I'd like to appeal to women with Asian heritage to talk more openly about breast checks. There is definitely a stigma and we need to change that.

The trek was the perfect way to mark the end of my cancer battle - and to make other women aware that life goes on. I'd never say I'm clear but I am a survivor. The trek was tough, but what kept me going was the motto: "It's not the altitude – it's the attitude."

Coronation Street star Sally Dynevor, 56, who was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2009 says of the trek: "I'm so glad I did it. It has drawn a huge line under my own breast cancer experience. It made me realise I'm stronger than I think I am. I'm ready for the next chapter."

TINNITUS DROVE MY HUSBAND TO TAKE HIS OWN LIFE'

Charity worker Linda Mitchell, 48, from Northampton,

loved going to gigs with her husband Glen. But after he developed tinnitus, the constant clamour in his head forced him to take drastic action

hat drew me to Glen was his wicked sense of humour - well, that and the fact that he was so good-looking. It was 1988 and we met in a pub in north London, where we were both living. I was 17 and Glen was 30 - quite an age gap – but I was older than my years and he was young for his. Plus we had so much in common.

After a few years we moved in together, but didn't bother with a wedding until 1999. Marriage wasn't that important to us – being together was what mattered.

When Glen was in his early 40s, he retired as a firefighter because of a knee injury. His pension meant he didn't need to work again, but he studied and found new jobs. He basically just enjoyed himself.

We loved seeing live bands and in April 2011, on Easter Sunday, we went to a pub gig. Everyone knows that feeling when you walk

out at the end of a gig with a bit of fuzziness in your ears - it's usually gone when you wake up. But this particular night the volume was so loud it hurt. and we left early.

In the morning I felt OK, but Glen still had pain and ringing in his ears. He couldn't get a GP appointment

for more than a week, so we googled his symptoms and everything pointed to tinnitus. We'd heard of it, but I didn't think it was that serious.

Glen was working in a Royal Mail sorting office at the time, but he struggled so much with the noise - which he'd never noticed

> before - he had to go off sick. By the following weekend he was in so much distress I took him

to Northampton General Hospital's out of hours clinic. It was so loud there he couldn't bear it, so they made an appointment for him to come back the next day. By then he was terrified that this painful, high-pitched squealing would never end,

but the doctor said it probably was tinnitus and assured Glen it would go in a few more days. It didn't - and he also had fluttering sensations that felt like bugs flying

around inside his head. He couldn't sleep and would pace the streets at 3am trying to exhaust himself so he could get some rest.

"Will it ever go away?" he said to me "Will I never hear quiet again?

After a two more weeks of suffering, he said, "If this was what life is going to be like, I'm going to end it."

straight to the GP's surgery and demanded an emergency appointment. We wanted to see an audiologist, but the GP said Glen would have to take a hearing test first - another two weeks away. He was just broken.



He was just 53

when he died

Glen was prescribed medication to help him sleep. By this time we were in separate rooms because he didn't want to disturb me. At 9am, I went in with a cup of coffee and found him barely conscious. He was lying on the bed with empty packets of pills on the floor so I called an ambulance.

It was too late for a stomach pump and they told me he would probably die given the amount he'd taken. But later that evening, he began to murmur and I felt hopeful he'd pull through.


All I could think was, "Please let this have reset his brain." You know how when a computer goes wrong so you turn it off and on again? I hoped the shock of what had happened would make the noise go away.

But when he came to, the noises were still there. "Why didn't you let me die?" he asked.

He was prescribed more medication – carefully controlled – to help him sleep. Once he started to sleep, a glimmer of the old Glen returned. He got an audiology appointment a week later and finally an explanation of what could be done.

He was given little ear devices that generate white noise to trick the brain into focusing on something else and was told to give them time to take effect.

Glen went back to work, but if there was a loud noise he'd have to go home. He started staying indoors and getting more and more anxious and depressed. The tinnitus got worse and developed into hyperacusis — oversensitivity to everyday sounds. I encouraged him to follow a normal life like the doctors said, but it felt like I was bullying him.

In June, his medication was changed and the new drug made his tinnitus and anxiety worse. He had a referral to the mental health crisis team, but everything was taking so long.

At an appointment in July 2011, the GP said he just had to wait. I saw the light going out in Glen's eyes. I wanted to scream, "Can't you see he's suicidal?" But I couldn't bring myself to say the words.

A day later, I came home from work to find Glen quite upbeat. It was his 53rd birthday in two days' time and he said he'd arranged to stay with a mate and have a night out. I was suspicious that he might try to take his own

life and, although I didn't say it outright, he read my mind. "I know you don't believe me, but I'm OK," he said." You're always telling me to get out and enjoy myself. That's all I'm doing."

In the end, I decided to believe him. I went to work the next day, 6 July, and when he called we chatted normally. But he didn't answer any of my texts after that. I suspected what he'd done, so I spoke to his friend without letting on about my worries and asked casually about Glen.

It was clear Glen had never planned a birthday outing with him. I had no idea where he was, so there was no point calling the police. The next day — Glen's birthday — there were officers waiting for me when I got home from work. "He's dead, isn't he?" I said.

"Let's go inside," said the officer.

Glen had been found in a Northampton hotel that morning. He'd left a note and the coroner ruled he'd killed himself. I know Glen didn't want to die. He just wanted to leave the hell of tinnitus behind.

RAISING AWARENESS

Now I work full-time for Deafconnect, a charity in Northamptonshire supporting people with hearing problems. Tinnitus affects more than seven million people in the UK and at least 850,000 of them have the same life-destroying symptoms as Glen. We campaign to raise awareness and encourage doctors and the people responsible for research funding to take the condition more seriously.

I miss Glen every day. At first, I couldn't bear to listen to the music we liked. He loved Pink Floyd and it was only last year that I got brave enough to see a local show about the band. I went alone — I couldn't share it with anyone because it was so emotional. Not having him there broke my heart, as did going to see *Bohemian Rhapsody*. He would have loved that film

I've gradually started doing the things we liked to do, but it's hard. I lost our past with him because it hurt so much to do those things — and I lost our future too.

TINNITUS EXPLAINED

■ Tinnitus is the name for hearing a sound in one ear, both ears or in the head that doesn't come from an external source. It can be linked to hearing loss caused by normal ageing or exposure to loud noise, but it can be a symptom of other ear conditions too. See your GP if you think you have it.

Sounds can include hissing, sizzling, buzzing, whooshing and white noise. There may be a single sound or more. It may be there all the time, or come and go.

People of all ages can get tinnitus, even children,

but it's more common in older adults. Many people have tinnitus for a short time – for example, after listening to loud music or when they have congestion because of a cold. Around one in eight of the UK population has tinnitus and one in 10 has life-debilitating symptoms.





THE LOWDOWN: The Greek capital is full of ancient treasures, but you'll also find modern street art, chic restaurants and excellent bars. THINGS TO DO: Perched on a rock above the city, the UNESCO-listed Acropolis is Athens' busiest attraction. You can pre-book tickets at etickets.tap.gr or visit as part of a group — we went with Athens Walking Tours (athenswalkingtours.gr). Dedicated to the goddess Athena, the Parthenon temple is awe-inspiring, as is the neighbouring Erechtheion with its imposing statues.

To see another side of the city, visit the Anafiotika neighbourhood, which has a quiet, island-like feel with its whitewashed buildings, cute alleys and sleepy cats. And don't miss the fascinating Changing of the Guard ceremony outside Parliament, where

guards in traditional costume perform an elaborate changeover ritual on the hour.

BITES AND BEVIES: For a true taste of Athens, order an espresso freddo from any café (this refreshing iced coffee is a local favourite) and grab a delicious pork souvlaki from Kostas, a highly regarded family-run grill in Monastiraki.

Celeb fans will love Nice n Easy (niceneasy. gr/en), an organic bistro serving dishes named



after showbiz legends. We especially enjoyed the freshly prepared Diana Ross tuna carpaccio and the perfectly seared Clint Eastwood rib eye steak.

Staying with the A-list theme, Papadakis (papadakisrestaurant.com) is owned by Greek celebrity chef Argiro Barbarigou, who's cooked for Barack Obama. We loved the melt-in-the-mouth chickpea stew, the fragrant prawn, chilli and feta dish and succulent grouper with truffle sauce.

The city also has fabulous bars, so start your cocktail crawl at Christmas-themed Noel, then sip something creative at award-winning The Clumsies before enjoying a nightcap at the A For Athens rooftop bar, which offers another amazing view of the Acropolis.

'I WANTED TO INJECT MY LIPS AND HAVE BOTOX!'

Actress Salma Hayek on considering surgery for her outrageous new role, her 'bossy' daughter and why she's still BFFs with Penélope Cruz

s the cream of Hollywood descends on La La Land for the Oscars, we catch up with legendary star Salma Hayek, to chat about her latest role and the changes she's seen in the industry since she got her big break in Desperado, opposite Antonio Banderas, in 1995.

The 53-year-old has since carved out a stellar career, appearing in blockbusters such as Once Upon A Time In Mexico, showing off her comedy credentials in Grown Ups and gaining an Oscar nomination for her incredible performance in Frida.

Now she's back on our screens in new comedy Like A Boss. She stars as a largerthan-life beauty mogul who Salma jokes is inspired by her "bossy" 12-year-old, Valentina, her daughter with businessman hubby François-Henri Pinault.

Here, she chats about how she came up with her character's out-there image, her enduring friendship with Penélope Cruz and the benefits of wearing fake teeth...

What changes have you seen in the film

industry over the course of your career, especially for women? I'm going to be 54 towards the end of 2020 and I couldn't have picked a better time to be born, because I think there have been so many amazing changes. We've got to keep strong and keep it up. For so long it was unimaginable that a woman beyond 35 would still be working. I've seen a lot of changes for women in the industry like that. Maybe we're not satisfied, but we can't deny that

> it's been huge and fast. It's a great beginning. It's still hard to get women behind the camera, though.


Which women have been particularly important to you?

I'm still best friends with Penélope Cruz. When it's something about the industry, she's someone I can really talk to. She understands my journey and what I've encountered. There's no one in the world who can do that better because we've had a similar journey.

What can you tell us about your character in *Like A Boss*?

The film is about two best friends, played by Rose Byrne and Tiffany Haddish, who are business partners, but their business runs into trouble. This is where my character comes in. I play Claire Luna, a businesswoman who offers to buy part of the company and pay their debts but, if I split their friendship, I get a majority of the company.





I'm not like my character at all, except I'm very bossy! I think every time you do business with a friend or a loved one, you're risking the relationship. Sometimes it works really well, but sometimes it doesn't. I actually have my husband in my production company. We've worked together for 20 years – I've been blessed - so it can work, but I've also had a lot of problems. Even if you lend money to a friend, get ready to lose the friendship.

What qualities make a good boss?

I think all females are incredible bosses. We are bossy by nature, we like to tell people what to do. I think every woman is strong, even if you feel you're not. Actually, beware the weak women! Sometimes they pretend they are victims, but they are strong because we can endure so many things.

My daughter, because she's bossy! No, it was more a collection of people. I was going with the fantasy of beauty. The hair was red, the


