


















BILLIE FAIERS

he Faiers sisters sure know how to throw a party to remember, and that was certainly the case when OK! was invited to Billie's Great Gatsby-themed 20s party.

After driving down a winding country road, guests were greeted at the historic Hedsor House – the same Buckinghamshire venue where Mark Ronson celebrated his 33rd birthday and scenes for *Killing Eve* were filmed. The hundreds of silver, gold and white balloons brought instant glamour to the front of the building and set the tone for the unforgettable evening.


Like Essex royalty, reality TV's Fab Four – Billie, her sister Sam and their partners Greg Shepherd and Paul Knightley – greeted OK! at the entrance. The couples posed against a backdrop adorned boldly with 'BILLIE', so nobody could forget who the day was all about.

The woman of the hour was dressed in a bespoke gown by Eamonn McGill, who flew over from Ireland to help Billie look her best. That she did as the floor-length dress sparkled under the light of the chandeliers – almost as if she had applied a filter in real life. She greeted her friends, including her former TOWIE co-star Ferne McCann. And where Billie goes, the camera crew for ITVBe's The Mummy Diaries follows, capturing the party for the upcoming seventh series.

In the main room, Billie carefully poured a tall champagne tower as husband Greg, 35, gathered everyone and announced, "Welcome to Billie's birthday brunch," to an eruption of cheers. Guests were then invited to the banqueting room where The Function Band were already up on podiums getting the party in full swing at just 4pm. Party goers walked past a nine-tier cake at the foot of a staircase that led to the









The surprises were far from over though. Greg soon reappeared as an Elton John tribute act and bellowed out *Tiny Dancer* in a sparkly one-piece, supported by the rest of the family, much to Billie's delight and amusement. That wasn't









the only treat from Greg, however, who told *OK*!, "I got her a Chanel handbag and a Cartier necklace. The kids made cards and I got flowers and balloons. I'm taking her to the Maldives – just me and her – too.

Greg also revealed he'd thrown a party with the same theme for his 30th, but on a much smaller scale. "Mine was like the pauper's one and this is the proper one!" he laughed. "We've got a little bit more money now."

Sam, 29, who also treated her big sister with a trip to New York and a Louis Vuitton bag, made a video of their friends and family wishing Billie a happy 30th birthday. She revealed the party had been a long time in the planning. "As soon as the wedding was over, it was like, 'What's the next big thing?' And obviously it was her 30th!"

And while many people get into a tizz about a milestone birthday, Sam says she and her sibling are looking forward to the future, "I just think the last 30 years have been amazing together but I enjoy getting older," she explained. "I feel like the next 30 years are going to be even better as we both have children to enjoy. We're so lucky that we're sisters and best friends."

With that said, all that was left to do was party, and that they did – until 2.30am. And when *OK*! caught up with Billie again a couple of days after her celebration, it's clear she's still on cloud nine as she gives us all the gossip from her big day...

Was it the best party ever party, Billie?

It couldn't have gone any better! I haven't stopped talking about it since and I've been inundated with messages from quests saying they had the best time. I can't wait to watch it all back because so much happened on the night, so it's a bit of a blur. I was overwhelmed. There were so many highlights, including when Greg sang Elton John with a full-blown family band. It was so much effort so I was touched,









and in shock. At the end of the brunch, Sam played a video of pre-recorded messages on the big screen. I'm not one for public speaking, but I just had to say a few words. My voice was going all funny because I was trying to hold back the tears. I was cringing about it the next day.

How late did you stay up?

The party finished at 1am, and then we went upstairs and shared a magnum of Whispering Angel wine with everyone who was staying, then we all went off to bed at 2.30am. It was such a long day, but I made sure I paced myself. Until about 10ish I was being really good. I wanted to be able to remember everything, and enjoy every second. I didn't want to peak too early!

Were there any dramas?

The person who was meant to make my dress let me down at the last minute, which was stressful. We found Eamonn, who flew in from Ireland to save the day. I gave him drawings of what I wanted, and he turned it around in two days. He did the fitting the night before the party! Thank God it all went well in the end.

How long have you been planning the party?

I started looking for venues in September, and my sister had her clothing launch at Hedsor House in October. When I walked in I fell in love with it straight away and Samantha said, "There's no chance of me having it for my 30th as your birthday is first." From that minute it was full-on planning. I always knew that I wanted to do a *Great Gatsby*-themed party for my 30th. I love the film, and the music. I was inspired by the Kardashians too – Kris Jenner had the theme for her 60th. We laughed because it was very similar to planning a wedding. The only difference was I didn't feel as much pressure!

How else have you celebrated?

It was really important to me that I spent my actual birthday with the kids. We picked Nelly up from school and went straight to my mum's







house for a little party. She did a buffet with an amazing cake and we had some champagne. I then had one day to pack for the surprise trip to New York. When we landed I only had three days until my party!

Were you surprised when Sam told you you were going to New York?

Yes, and with the way she presented it to me. She bought me a Louis Vuitton vanity trunk, and told me not to open it and ran out the room. She came back in dressed as the Statue of Liberty, and inside the trunk was all New York things. I was blown away! I didn't know what to do so I let out a massive scream. My mum is also taking us to Capri, and Greg surprised me with a trip to the Maldives the day after the party for our wedding anniversary. It's only for

three nights so it is a long way to go, but it's our favourite place in the world. I was like, "I can't take any more surprises."

What did you girls get up to on your trip?

So much, but we did have a bit of a problematic journey. We got on the plane, and then it was delayed for three hours, but I said, "Let's not worry about it as there's nothing we can do." We missed the first day of activities, but it was fine. The Baccarat Hotel was amazing, and we packed in so many touristy bits, shopping and nice meals. We didn't stop for three days. Sam had a jam-packed itinerary. She printed it out and put it in my birthday card so I knew exactly what to pack. I said to Sam, "I've now got a whole year to plan for your 30th." I need to think of something really good.

You posted an Instagram story about people complaining about you laughing on the flight. What happened?

We were doing funny Snapchat filters and having a giggle before we took off, and a lady sitting a couple of rows in front kept turning around and going, "Shhhh." She complained about us to the air hostess and the way she approached it was quite rude. I was like, "Sorry, have I missed something here? Are we not even allowed to laugh these days?" Everything is a bit too PC – we were just excited about our trip to New York. She stormed off, and I never do this, but I posted on Instagram about it. Then we were in the air so I didn't know the effect it had. Paul sent Samantha a link to a story that had been written about it. I sometimes forget that I





have a bigger platform. I don't think I'll be doing that again in a hurry [laughs].

Did Mummy Diaries cameras go with you to New York?


Yes. We do go away on holiday a lot, which is lovely, but we pretty much have the cameras with us the whole time so it's still kind of work. We share everything, and that's why the show works. It's just become second nature to us now. 
How do you feel about being 30?

ourselves the Three Musketeers. I know a lot of people have a close relationship with their siblings and parents, but we do have an extra special bond.


time, but it was the final piece of the puzzle. As a family we've got a lot to look forward to.

BREAKFAST IS SERVED!

THE DUCHESS OF CAMBRIDGE GETS HANDS-ON DURING A BUSY WEEK OF ENGAGEMENTS



he Duchess of Cambridge revealed she encourages her children to try new experiences with an "if you don't try you'll never know" attitude. She made her comments while serving up a breakfast fit for a king at a south London nursery.

Channelling her mum, Carole Middleton, who used to be a British Airways air hostess, Kate made a perfect "trolley dolly" as she wheeled in a selection of healthy goodies for the school children.

Clearly in her element, the playful duchess – who's been dubbed the children's princess by royal fans – high-fived the pupils from Stockwell Gardens Nursery and Pre-School. She then poured out cereals and milk for the excited three and four-year-olds before encouraging her young audience to make their own breakfast, asking, "What do you think of the fruit, what's your favourite?"

Discussing her own children's diet, the 38-year-old mum of three said that Princes George and Louis and Princess Charlotte are all big fans of beetroot. "Mine absolutely love it – it's one of those things, until you try it you don't know," she told one of the trainee chefs from the London Early Years Foundation chef academy.

Kate likes to grow fresh produce for her family at their Norfolk









home, Anmer Hall, and also on a small patch of land near Kensington Palace, listing carrots, beans and beetroot among their harvest. Having taken off her petrol blue Jigsaw

coat, the duchess didn't appear at all concerned about making a mess of her £80 cream merino wool jumper by Sézane as she got stuck into a messy play session.

Kate's visit to the school gave her a chance to discuss her Early Years project while learning more about the importance of "good nutritious food for child development".

Speaking about her landmark nationwide survey called Five Big Questions On The Under Fives, she said, "I want to hear society's views about raising the next generation. I'm so happy that over 100,000 people from across the UK have already completed it, and I can't wait to see the results." Her busy

week – due to be topped by a glamorous night at the BAFTA Awards – was a sign of Kate's growing role. In the wake of the Sussexes' recent departure, she is very much taking her place "front and centre" of the royal family. Contrary to reports that she's "in a panic" since Megxit, Kate appeared more confident than ever and typically hands-on during her interaction with the children.


The previous day, Kate had a Marilyn Monroe moment as she battled a gust of wind outside the Evelina London Children's Hospital. The duchess laughed as she held on to the skirt of her Dolce & Gabbana tweed suit. It prompted suggestions that she hasn't yet picked up Her Majesty the Queen's tip of having small weights sewn into the hems of her skirts and dresses – at least not with this particular outfit!

After being presented with a gorgeous bouquet, Kate got stuck into some arts and












open arms. The 31-year-old is bubbly and fresh-faced – worlds away from the person who spent a month in hospital.

The Bridge's

Frankie shares her sixbedroom home with her husband Wayne and their sons Parker, six, and Carter, four. It features a dressing room one could only dream of, a children's

play area and stables that have been converted into a gym

Here, over a cup of peppermint tea, Frankie opens up to *OK*! about overcoming suicidal thoughts, her eating disorder and how Wayne has been her rock...



It was mainly to help people, which I hope it does. It's mostly about hope. When your mental health is bad, you lose that hope. I just felt I was a prime example of how you can have a really bad time and still live your life and achieve things. My psychologist Mal and my psychiatrist Mike are in the book to explain the medical side of it. They've helped me understand my illness.



I don't think there was ever a particular thing that triggered it, I think I was just born that way.

Has Wayne read your book?

No. He's only ever read one book! I've recorded the audiobook so he's waiting for that. He's always been really supportive of it. He says it's the thing he's most proud of me for.

Would you like Parker and Carter to read it one day?

I wouldn't mind if they read it. They were a big part of why I wanted to get better, even before they were born. I always wanted a family but

I knew I wouldn't have been capable of being a parent when I wasn't well. My mental health has been massively better since becoming a mum. The boys give me a purpose and a reason to get up in the morning.

In the book you say your biggest fear is Parker and Carter ending up with mental health issues...

It's something I'll always worry about. Even before I had them I'd think, "I hope they end up with Wayne's brain, ▷





not mine. I hope they have enough of Wayne in them to not be like me." I notice little bits of me in both of them and I'm super aware of it. Parker's a bit more sensitive than Carter. I hope I'll be able to have open conversations with them. People have suffered with depression on both sides of my family so I do think it plays a role, but it's also circumstantial.

How do you manage your mental health?

For me, I need a mixture of therapy and medication. I couldn't do one without the other. It's something I'll always have to manage – I'll be on medication for as long as I need it. There seems to be this stigma around medication, but I think whatever is going to get you through your life, do it. Anxiety wise, I don't really suffer much any more. I still get anxious but I haven't had a panic attack since Parker was little. I still have hard days that can be caused by anything, like being too busy or not being busy enough. But it's never as bad as it used to be.

Looking back, how do you view your time in hospital?

It was a relief to be in hospital. I definitely wasn't capable of looking after myself at that point. I had no idea what was going on and I felt completely out of control. I'd lost who I was. I was exhausted, constantly crying

and I couldn't function any longer. It was a real relief to go somewhere and know I was going to be taken care of. When I look back now I don't really recognise that person and I'm so grateful I could go there. A lot of that was to do with Wayne. Wayne was the one who rang the doctor and took me to the hospital straight from the airport after a video shoot abroad with The Saturdays.

Do you feel like Wayne helped save you?

Yes. Wayne was the person who made me realise that something wasn't quite right. He was the one who urged me to get help and he supported me right from the start. He has been my rock and has had to learn a lot along the way. While I was in hospital, he had lots of sessions with Mal and Mike so they could explain what was happening and why I was the way I was. I think that helped him.

In your book you reveal how Wayne lost weight during that time...

He lost a lot of weight and we think it was probably down to stress. I had no idea what was going on to be honest. There are times when friends say, "I came to see you that day," and I just don't remember any of it. I was so unaware of the outside world.

How do you think it affected your relationship with Wayne?

It made me realise we wanted to be together. He made that real effort to help me through it and that was a big thing for me. It helped me get better because I knew someone loved me and wanted me to be better.

Wayne could have easily left but he didn't.







You write about how one of the side effects of your medication is a loss of libido. Has that been difficult?

Yeah, I think that was probably the biggest thing. It's a side effect with nearly all medications. It's annoying because we're only young! But I'd rather be here.

You also open up about having suicidal thoughts when you were in traffic before your hospitalisation...

I was annoyed at myself because I got stuck in traffic and was running late. And that turned into, "I'm a useless person and Wayne should be with someone better. I want to drive into the wall, but I'm stuck in traffic, I can't even do that right!" I went from 0 to 100 over something so small. You just get to the point where you feel like that's the only way out. I'm so terrified of death that I would never have followed it through, and I also had the

guilt of leaving people, even though I thought they'd be better off without me. Now I can't imagine thinking that way.


Were you at your worst mentally when you were in The Saturdays?

Yes, but it was a mix of things. You're so busy and have a lack of control of your life. You get told what you're doing every day. But I loved it, too. I don't want people to think I hated my time in The Saturdays because I'd do it again. It was just unfortunate that I was ill through it. I was going out seven nights a week and drinking was blocking stuff out.

Did the girls know?

In my head, yes, but I don't know. Everyone remembers things differently. Mollie [King] has seen me have a panic attack, but I don't think anyone realised how bad things were until





Were they supportive?

Always. I spent around four weeks in hospital, but we had a tour booked and I really wanted to do it, so I probably came out too soon. I did so well at hiding it, so it must have been a big adjustment for everyone.

Will we ever see The Saturdays reunite?

I really don't think we will. It's hard to align everyone to be ready at the same time, but I would be up for it one day.

Did the pressure of having to look a certain way in the industry affect you?

Yes, but I also think that comes down to myself and my perfectionism and confidence. You get to the point where people are used to seeing you a certain way and you want to stay that way. It wasn't until I was pregnant with Parker

that I realised how restrictive my diet was. I ate to survive. Now I'm the total opposite.

Did you have an eating disorder?

Mal said I had an eating disorder but never said I had anorexia or anything in particular. When I was in hospital I saw people with eating disorders and I was nowhere near as bad. When I went into hospital, I was so full of adrenaline all the time and had so much anxiety, I genuinely wasn't hungry, and I had the constant shakes because I didn't have enough sugar in my body. There were days in the band when I wouldn't

eat a thing. Then once I came out of hospital I genuinely wanted to eat but I just couldn't. I would live off soup and these protein shakes that Mal and Mike would make me have.

Do you think you'll always be selfconscious about the way you look?

Yes, annoyingly. There will always be a part of me that wishes I looked a bit more like I used to, even though I know that's unhealthy. My weight affects my mood and Mike knows that. Being pregnant was really hard for me. I had absolutely no control

over my body for the first time ever and I think it was the realisation that I'd never be the same again. Sometimes I wish it hadn't made me discover my love for food, but it did and I know that's a good thing.

You also talk about your OCD in the book...

Germs are still one of my biggest things. I just can't help it and I hate it. When I'm out in public places I do still find it really hard, especially with the kids. If I take them to the toilet, I don't want them to touch anything. I also can't sit in the corner of a restaurant or next to a wall because I fell like all the dirt is in the corner.

Would you and Wayne like to have any more children?

I don't know. I'm broody at the minute and Wayne's like, "Oh God!" It depends if I baby trap him [laughs].

How long have you lived here?

Since March. It's half done. We need to replace the doors and get a new table in the kitchen. Wayne says it's our forever home. I think it will be, but I'm more realistic and I know what we're like [laughs].

What's your favourite room?


The kitchen. It's probably the most finished. We're going to paint the island a different colour and change all the handles. The view of the garden is so nice and I love the sofa. It's the room where the family is always hanging

out. The boys don't even use their toy room because they want to be with us. OK!

'I ONLY STARTED FEELING LIKE A PROFESSIONAL ACTOR A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO!'

BRAD PITT OPENS UP ABOUT HIS AWARDS SEASON SUCCESS, FINDING FAME IN LOS ANGELES AND THE MAJOR FILM ROLE HE TURNED DOWN

ctor Brad Pitt has had the spotlight firmly focused on him this awards season.
First he had the audience in giggles at his acceptance speech for Outstanding Performance By A Male Actor for Once Upon A Time In Hollywood at the SAG Awards, then he started a fan frenzy when he was pictured embracing his ex-wife Jennifer Aniston amid reports they've rekindled their romance. Despite his success and being favourite to scoop an Oscar next week, the 56-year-old is refreshingly modest, insisting, "I have a lot to be grateful for."

After a career as an extra, Brad landed a role in the 1991 smash hit *Thelma & Louise*. Speaking about his now-iconic role as charming hustler JD, Brad says, "I think they were desperate, to tell you the truth."

Here, Brad opens up about his career, working alongside Leonardo DiCaprio and the major Hollywood film role he turned down...

You've had an amazing awards season so far with Once Upon A Time In Hollywood...

It's really fun when your number comes up. I look at it this way, it's a kind of a wheel of fortune, and there's so much good work every year. It's so nice to see your friends go through this and then it's nice to be here myself. So I have a lot to be grateful for.





What was it like working alongside Leonardo DiCaprio?

He's alright [laughs]. No, he's good as gold and what I love about him is he puts everything in and really goes for each scene.

Is it true the pair of you relaxed between scenes with pottery?

No! [Laughs] I don't know where [that rumour] came from. I spend a lot of time in a sculpture studio, and somehow that turned into a *Ghost* moment with me and Leo at the pottery wheel!

You majored in journalism at the University of Missouri...

Yeah, it was one of the best [journalism] schools in the country, and I had loved All The President's Men, so the idea of investigative journalism appealed to me. But then, it didn't. I just started finding myself being drawn more to design and maybe magazine layout or something, but I always had a love for film.

Before the end of your degree, you moved to LA. What prompted that decision?

It was a week before graduation and I realised that all of my friends had jobs and I didn't. I had a friend who talked about going out to LA. Her dad had a place and it was just one of those things that hit me. I literally loaded up

the car. I didn't graduate. All I had to do was hand in a term paper, but in my head, I was done. I was going west.

Did you have a place to stay?

My friend let me stay at her dad's, but no one was there except a maid who spoke Thai. I didn't have a lot of people to talk to at that point.

Did you find work straight away?

No, I landed and I got the newspaper. I had \$275 to my name, and I saw in the paper that you could sign up for extra work, so I signed up for three jobs.

When did you feel you'd crossed over to become a professional actor?

A couple of weeks ago [laughs]. Listen, I've had some different junctures along the way, where I would actually call myself a professional actor. Once my first film *Thelma & Louise* hit, I tried some different things. One of the big pinnacles for me was meeting

the director David Fincher; he understood so much more than I did, and I found direction that way.

Thelma & Louise was a huge film. Did it feel that way on set?

I was certainly aware. I'm more aware of how high my voice is in that [laughs]. My ass must have been clenched so tight being the first [film]. I had nothing

to show for myself, except for my extra work, and they took a chance on me. I think they were desperate, to tell you the truth.

You've had so many incredible roles but have you ever lost out on a good part? If we were doing a show on the great movies

I've passed on, we'd need two nights.

Can you give us an example?

Brad as JD

in Thelma &

Louise

I did pass on *The Matrix*. I took the red pill. Just to clarify [laughs]!

aking the leap from children's presenter to Queen of daytime TV is no mean feat but Holly Willoughby has made the transition look effortless. At the NTAs she cemented her position as the jewel in This Morning's crown with viewers voting in their dozens for the daytime show.

Adored by fans for her relatability and down-to-earth nature, Holly is the celebrity everyone secretly wants to count as their BF, getting style tips from her while gossiping over a glass of vino. Holly's chemistry with This Morning co-host Phillip Schofield is the stuff of TV producers' dreams. But don't be fooled by her giggly demeanour. She's not afraid to show her emotions when empathising with a guest over a heart-wrenching story but is suitably firm when tackling politics with the likes of Boris Johnson and Jeremy Corbyn.

Lauded for her fabulous wardrobe choices, she typically turned heads at last week's NTAs in a stunning Peter Langner dress. Unfortunately it didn't stay quite as pristine as she'd hoped. She later admitted spilling champagne on it earlier in the


I thought, "Oh God, he hates me. He

Ant: We always talk ourselves out of it. By the time we're on to the red carpet, we're like, "We're not going to win it." **Dec:** We never take it for granted and every year the palms get sweatier and the heart starts beating a little bit faster. You feel like you're going to be sick just that little bit more every year. The relief, when they open the envelope and call out your name, is palpable. Ant: Yeah, because it's going to end one day, it has to. So we just kind of sit there and feel grateful to be there.

feel grateful to be there. **Dec:** Every year we go, "It will end... but please not tonight!"

Are you running out of places to put your awards? Ant: Oh, we squeeze them into any crevice that will take them. Anywhere there's a little hole, we'll fit an NTA.

You are up there with the legends of TV presenting. How does that feel? Dec: I don't think you stop and smell the roses very often, you're always kind of working on the next thing. We're in the middle of *Britain's Got Talent* and we're about to start *Saturday Night Takeaway* again, so it doesn't really cross our minds. We're always looking forward.

If you stopped now you'd still go down in history...

Ant: Well, that is a very big thing to say! We've been working together for 30 years this year, so that in itself is one hell of an achievement. So we're going to hopefully celebrate it in some way – watch this space. We just love what we do and we're very privileged to be in this business, because it's a brilliant business.







a lot of weight. After going on a massive diet, I now want to know exactly what I'm putting in my body. I'm always the one reading the back of packet.


Is that why you're supporting Danone's campaign?







'LOVE IS TERRIFYING'

SINGER **BILLIE EILISH** ON FINDING FAME YOUNG, SCARY NIGHT TERRORS AND WHY SHE'S NOT READY TO FALL IN LOVE

he 2020 Grammys undoubtedly belonged to Billie Eilish. The 18-year-old became the first person to pick up all of the Grammys "big four" awards – which include Best New Artist, Album Of The Year, Song Of The Year and Record Of The Year – since 1981. Her debut album When We All Fall Asleep, Where Do We Go?, was crowned, making her the youngest ever winner of the coveted accolade.

She is also set to record the Bond theme for the new film No Time To Die. But the teen has revealed that fame comes at a cost and recently admitted she considered taking her own life in 2018 after becoming overwhelmed with her new celebrity status. She said, "I don't want to be too dark, but I genuinely didn't think I'd make it to 17."

Here, Billie discusses her homeschool upbringing, why she's scared of love and her terrifying nightmares...

Your album is called When We All Fall Asleep, Where Do We Go? Are you a good sleeper? Not at all. I have these terrifying dreams. Sleep paralysis, night terrors. It's like the whole night is terrifying and then I wake up.

Billie won big on the night

They really mess me up so the whole day is off sometimes.

Your video Bury A Friend is creepy. Do your nightmares give you ideas for songs?

They've given me a couple of ideas for my songs. I probably wouldn't have made that song the way it is if I hadn't had sleep paralysis and nightmares.

Some of your fans have expressed their concerns for you online, asking if you're okay. Can they relax?

They can relax. I'm just living, making my art. It's a really dark time and I'm speaking about it. I don't write from my perspective a lot so you never know what you're getting, if it's from me or if it's from my creative side.

Your song I Love You is a beautiful ballad. Are the words hard to sing?

Oh God, that song destroyed me. Love is terrifying. Just being in love with someone takes over everything about you and changes all of the decisions that you make and changes the way you think about things.

You were homeschooled. Did you enjoy it?

I loved homeschooling. My life rocked because I never actually wanted to go to school. I never wanted to learn the s**t they were learning.

How did you feel about turning 18 in December?

I've been looking forward to turning 18 since I was born.

THIS SKIN CONDITION CAN RUIN LIVES - SO HOW CAN WE PREVENT AND MANAGE IT?

t's been reported that the number of people with eczema is on the rise – Allergy UK estimates it affects up to 15 million people in the UK alone.

The dry skin condition results in itchy, red and scaly skin. A-listers aren't immune either – Jade Jagger says she has lived with the condition for decades and Nicole Kidman and Nadia Sawalha have suffered

too. There are several types of eczema. Atopic dermatitis is the most common and there is often a family history of this.

Other forms include irritant dermatitis – for example after excess hand washing – and contact allergic dermatitis, which can occur after exposure to an allergen such as hair dye. We spoke to top dermatologist Dr Jennifer Jones to find out more...

Extreme heat can aggravate eczema, but the worst time of the year for sufferers is actually winter as cold air can dry the skin out more. Wearing gloves can reduce flare-ups on hands.



The most important thing to do is moisturise regularly with rich cream. Doing this four times a day should lead to a significant improvement in the condition. A dermatologist will be able to advise you on the best cream to use.

If you suffer from eczema, avoid anything that will dry out your skin even more. Ditch your usual detergents and soaps, and ask your pharmacist for advice on what you can use that will not irritate your skin.





OK! HEALTH&FITNESS





Using hemp-based products can be helpful as it has anti-inflammatory properties. Coconut oil can also soothe irritated skin. Skin Salvation (£11.05 from amazon. co.uk), is a natural product which contains beeswax and vitaminrich organic hemp seed and olive oils.



If you had eczema as a child you may well have grown out of it. Around 30-50 per cent of children suffer some degree of eczema, which then reduces to around 2-10 per cent in adulthood.

> Your GP can help you determine whether something in your diet, like dairy or gluten, is the culprit. But cut out alcohol, as this will just dry the skin out more.

For me, exercise is the best form of therapy. You just have to believe in yourself, because you hold the power to get through it.




Just don't put too much pressure on yourself and try not to listen to what other people say. How you feel about yourself is the important thing.

SERVES TWO; PREPARATION TIME: 10 MINUTES; COOKING TIME: 25 MINUTES

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 medium red onion, sliced
- 1 yellow pepper, sliced
- 2 tsp piri-piri seasoning
- 1 whole hot red chilli (option-
- al if you like it very spicy!)1 400g tin of chopped tomatoes
- Salt and pepper
- 1 tsp balsamic vinegar
- 4 large British Lion eggs
- Chopped parsley to garnish
- Chunky bread to serve

s it hot in here? This hearty pot of spicy goodness is best served with a slice of fresh white chunky bread to make sure no drop of golden egg yolk goes neglected. A perfect winter warmer for these recent chilly evenings.

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large lidded frying pan over a high heat and add the red onion and yellow peppers.
- onion and yellow peppers.

 2. Fry on a high heat
 for a couple of minutes
 then reduce the heat, put
 the lid on and sweat the
 vegetables for 10 minutes
 until they are soft and lightly
 coloured.
- **3.** Remove the lid, add the piri-piri seasoning and whole chilli (if using) and fry for another minute.
- **4.** Then add the chopped tomatoes and 100ml water, season with salt and pepper and simmer for 8 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- **5.** Add the balsamic vinegar, stir and then crack in the eggs one by one. Put the lid on the frying pan and cook for 5 minutes or until the whites are set.
- **6.** Garnish with chopped parsley and serve with chunky bread.

1. Heat a non-stick frying pan over a medium heat and toast the seeds until they start to pop. Add the tablespoon of honey and continue cooking for a minute or so until the honey has reduced, and the seeds are browned.

2. Pour onto a sheet of greaseproof paper and leave. The seeds will crisp up as they cool.

3. Clean the frying pan.

4. Sift the flour and baking powder together in a bowl. Stir in the caster sugar. Then

crack in the eggs and start whisking. Slowly pour in the milk and whisk until the batter is thick and smooth.

5. Add the lemon zest and olive oil and whisk again until everything is incorporated.

6. Melt a little olive oil in the frying pan over a medium heat and spoon the batter into 10cm pancakes. Cook on one side until bubbles appear, then flip over and finish cooking on the other side. Repeat with the remaining batter until it is all used. Keep the pancakes warm while you prepare the bananas and blueberries.

7. Over a medium heat, melt the butter in the same frying pan (no need to clean it out) and add the bananas, cut side down. You may need to cook them in batches. Cook gently until the bananas are coloured on one side and beginning to soften then flip them over and finish off the other side. Remove from the pan and keep warm.

8. Add the blueberries to the pan and cook gently for a couple of minutes. Add the lemon juice and 2 teaspoons of runny honey and continue to cook until the blueberries begin to burst. This will take 1-2 minutes.

9. Serve the pancakes warm, with the cooked bananas, blueberries and cooking juice. Top with the toasted seeds, a little Greek yoghurt and an extra drizzle of runny honey if you like.




